On Sentember 17, 24 of our aircreft took part in the opening phase of the combat operation "Market" dropping 295 paratroops in the vicinity of Grossbeak. The military object was to strengthen the overation against Nijmeren. The sollowing day, the 18th, ? of our planes towed gliders in single tow, formation, to the same area visited the previous day. The gliders towed were those of the 95th and 97th Squadrons of the 44th Troop Carrier Group. sour days of bad weather then intervened nolding back the plenned reinforcements of glider troops which were badly needed by the beleaguered ground forces, sinally, on the 23rd of September, all of our glider pixets flow CG-4A's, tugged by ?l or our planes as well as those of other squadrons in the group. Our glider piact strength med been enlarged so that we had 49 men on our roster the plioted gliders. This was our mission #32 and another phase of the operation "market". Toe landing zone on each of these three combat missions was approximately the same. The route flown was also similar in each case, namely from Fulbeck, across the Channel and over the Dutch island of Schousen, south of Rotterdam, along the Mass River to Grossbeek, near the German border. The route back was a northward turn toward Nijmegen and then westward to England again.

Our first serious combat lesses were experienced in these three missions.

Of the four personnel missing in action, two, enlisted men and an officer, were seen to bail out of their plane along with the rest of its crew. No further word has been received correrning them. The full report of our lesses is embodied in section d of pages 4 and 5 of this report. Our lesses this month are the only ones we have had to dete.

A large number of our planes were fired upon by ground installations, flak
as well as small arms, during the Dutch operations, but we are very fortunate in
having suffered no nircraft losses. In the glider phase of our operations, one
glider pilot was lost, all the others safely evacuated and returned to us. Typical
statements of these men as they returned from the combat zone and were interrogated
will be found excerpted and ettached as an appendix to this report.
